SLT Drop ins

After School Activities

Following feedback from parents around after school activities, you will shortly receive a timetable outlining the activities on offer this academic year. Attendance

We all know how important school attendance is. Latest research shows at KS2, pupils who attended school nearly every day in Year 6 (with an attendance rate of 95-100%) were 1.3 times more likely to achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to pupils who only attended 90-95% of the time. This means missing just 10 days of year 6 reduced the likelihood of reaching the expected standard by around 25%. Pupils who attended nearly every day were 1.8 times more likely to achieve the standard than persistently absent pupils who only attend 85-90% of the time (relating to 4 - 6 weeks more time in school). After the half term holidays, we will be sending out your child's attendance figure. Whenever possible please ensure your child attends school every day and try to make all appointments outside of the school hours. If you have any questions over this, please contact the school office.
